

My work with Prajwal School Nepal by Sue Page.

In 2020 Purna Shrestha asked me if I would like to make sound recordings of English words and sentences for children at the Praiwal School in Makawanpur, Nepal to help their children learn English.

My first objective was to set up the technology to be able to do the recordings and send the information to the school. It was a painful case of 'learn as you go' but eventually I had set up the files on my computer and online ready for uploading the words and sentences to transmit to the school. I also recorded the first set of words, and then set about recruiting Guild members to do the recording. This was not a great success, but in 2021 publicity on the project had brought interest from young people working towards either their Queens Guide or Duke of Edinburgh Gold Awards.

I had already divided up the lists of words into blocks.

I added to these the link to the Google Sharing folder.

I also produced a set of instructions on how to do the audio recording. labelling of words in the Sounds folder and how to upload to the online Google Sharing Folder.

Prajwal School - Instructions for voice recording


- 1) Read the word slowly and clearly
- 2) When saving the voice file, please write the full word as a file name.
- 3) Save the words in a separate folder label e.g. Colours, Weather words etc.

6. Days of the week

In phase one, we recorded about 1000

In March 2023 I received a request to record a set of words phonetically, having spent some time dividing the words into manageable sets, I was able to recruit 2 Ranger Guides working towards their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award. They set to work and most of the lists were completed by September. I then contacted a local high school D of E group and was able to recruit 2 young people working towards their Gold D of E Award. I was able to meet them personally and give them some training, as



I then recruited 2 Ranger Guides to do the recording. Louise and Amy and continued to record some of the word groups myself. Amy a Ranger Guide was working towards her Queens Guide Award, which she achieved in the summer of 2023.



well as the set of instructions. After the initial problems were overcome they have now almost completed work on the phonics and will soon be working on a new set of sentences and phrases. As they will be working with me for a year, I hope to complete this third set of words by September 2024.
